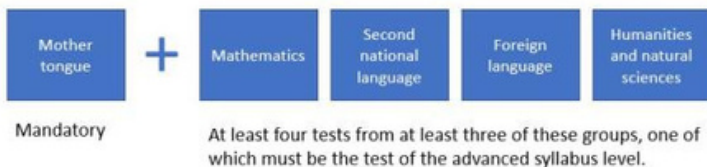

To graduate, students must complete at least **150 credits**, of which **20 credits** must be completed through national optional studies. A single study unit typically carries 2 credits. Generally, during the first year of studies, students mainly complete compulsory studies. In the second year, they then take optional study units, especially in the subjects they plan to take in the matriculation examination. The matriculation examination is based on the contents of both compulsory and national optional studies.

Matriculation Examination

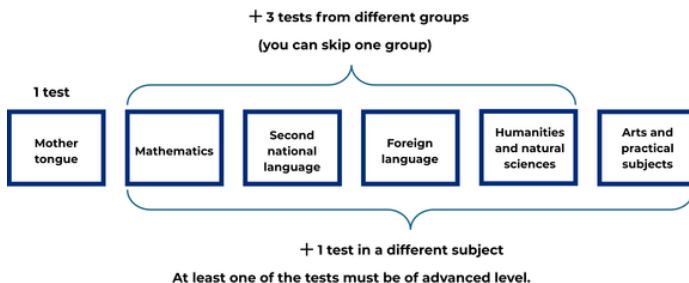


The matriculation examination must include exams in at least five subjects. All candidates must take the exam in mother tongue and literature (or Finnish as a second language and literature). You may choose four additional exams from at least three different groups, which include:

- the exam in the second national language
- a foreign language exam
- the mathematics exam
- an exam in a humanities and natural sciences subject.



The examination must include at least one exam at the advanced level. The first matriculation examinations in skills and arts subjects will be held in autumn 2029 in visual arts, physical education, and music. A candidate may choose a skills or arts subject exam as one of the five exams required for the examination.



Wilma for Guardians

Every guardian of an underage student must follow the student's matters through the Wilma online service.

1. Go to edutampere.inschool.fi/connect and create a Wilma account using your email address.
2. After confirming your email, select the right school and complete strong authentication through the Suomi.fi service using online banking credentials.
3. Link your dependant's information, check your details, and create a password for your account. Your email address will serve as your Wilma username.
4. In the future, you can log in using your username and password, either through the browser version or the Wilma mobile app. Please note that only a limited selection of Wilma's features is available in the app.

If you are unable to create an account through strong authentication, please contact the school office.

Please remember to complete the Wilma form for giving permission to borrow a laptop. If this form has not been completed, the student cannot be issued a laptop.

Follow your Wilma messages, your child's Wilma entries, and the announcements visible to guardians in Wilma. Guardians are responsible for explaining the absences of underage students in Wilma.
