



Dear Student,

A student participating in practical work training in the work activity units of social services and health care **must be protected against measles and chickenpox either by vaccination or through past infection, and those who attend infants should be protected against pertussis (Whooping Cough) by vaccination.** In addition, annual influenza vaccinations are required for which you will receive instructions during your study period. (Infectious Diseases Act 1227/2016 Section 48§). The required vaccines are free of charge for students of social and health care.

Please fill in the form and **keep it safe**, as you will need it when applying for practical work training in the work activity units of social and health care. If you do not know which vaccinations you have received, you may enquire about them at the school or student health care service of the institution you last attended.

When you begin your studies, you can complete the vaccine protection in student health care.

Please take care of your MPR vaccination before starting your studies. The vaccine is available free of charge at the health centre.

A past infection or two vaccinations provide protection against the disease. *If a person has not been infected by all MPR diseases in the past, or if the vaccinations have only been administered in part, a further MPR vaccination must be administered.* The person receiving the vaccination must not be pregnant nor become pregnant within the three months following the vaccination.
